Each level of The Monument is accessed by a spiral staircase, with 246 steps to the top of the tower.

Car parking is provided for visitors and there is a complimentary shuttle bus service to The Monument.

## The Hall of Arms

Watch the animated film 'Wallace – The Making of a Hero' to discover how William Wallace became the leader of the Scots. Hear how he rose from obscurity to fight against injustice, and see the legendary Wallace Sword – a powerful symbol of his courage and skill.



## The Hall of Heroes

Since the first bust was installed in 1886, The Hall of Heroes has told the story of illustrious Scots who have followed in Wallace's footsteps. Today it commemorates thirty of Scotland's heroes and heroines, each of whom has made their own contribution to the history of the nation.



## The Royal Chamber

See how the weapons of Wallace's time were used, and discover how the Battle of Stirling Bridge was fought and won. Design your own Coat of Arms and then picture yourself as you prepare for battle! Use the viewfinder to learn about the landmarks which Wallace would have seen in 1297.



## The Crown

On reaching the top of the famous spiral staircase you will be rewarded with panoramic views in all directions, across Scotland's historic heartland. Look out over the landscape of the Forth Valley – which has witnessed so many important moments in the story of Scotland.



## The Abbey Craig

Follow The Wallace Way with its timeline of woodcarvings telling the history of Stirling. Explore the woodland trails to find stunning viewpoints of the surrounding landscape.
